Introduction

Following the opening of Albert Street on **5 January 2025**, there will be more bus stops available for buses in the Eastside of Birmingham, along Corporation Street (opposite the Square Peg pub) and on Albert Street.

The following bus services will continue to run as normal but with some minor diversions in the city centre and a change to bus stop location: 2, 3, 4, 4A, 5, 6, 23, 24, 33, 45, 47, 51, 61, 63, 97, 97A, 822, 907, 907A, 934, 935, 936, 937, 937A, 997, 997S, X21, X22, X51 & FD

Transport for West Midlands (TfWM) is working in

Key travel messages

If you usually start or end your bus journey by Moor Street Station, Carrs Lane, Bull Street or Priory Queensway in Birmingham City Centre, your bus route is still operating. You will still be able to get your bus close to where you currently do, however the stop you need to get on and off at may have changed.

Some stops in the Eastside of Birmingham will be changing and moving to new locations from 5 January 2025.	Your bus stop may have changed so plan ahead and check your journey in both directions of travel.	Familiarise yourself with the new bus stops; another route/stop might suit your destination better.	Safety first – Eastside of Birmingham is still undergoing significant regeneration. For your own safety use the designated walking routes to get to your destination. These are signposted

Albert Street is to reopen on 5 January 2025 following the track work installation for West Midlands Metro.

As a result, some bus stops in the Eastside area of Birmingham are changing to improve the flow of traffic and offer additional stops.




